In this month of the Holy Cross, what does it mean to us? What did it mean to the Blessed Martyrs of Japan (feast day September 10)? Faith is important, and our Catholic Sacraments bond us to an ideal that is not worth giving up! In the apostasy of our times, many have given up, surrendering to the snares of the devil.


Notably, Jesuit survivors of the 17th century Japanese persecution (which occurred at Nagasaki) fled to The Philippines, which remained Christian-Catholic. That area provides spiritual example to present days.

Franciscans are called to live "Gospel Lives," which reflect gospel values. One of those is, (John 6; 50-55): This is the bread which cometh down from heaven; that if any man eat of it, he may not die.

I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever; and the bread that I will give, is my flesh, for the life of the world. The Jews therefore strove among themselves, saying: How can this man give us his flesh to eat? Then Jesus said to them: Amen, amen I say unto you: Except you eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, you shall not have life in you. He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath everlasting life: and I will raise him up in the last day.

We, like the Japanese Martyrs, appreciate the link to "Manna from Heaven," which gives us life in the wilderness, leading to "everlasting life." Our Franciscan spirit within the Catholic Tradition has an accompanying attachment, related to apostolic zeal: (Luke 48)—"But he that knew not, and did things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few stripes. And unto whomsoever much is given, of him much shall be required: and to whom they have committed much, of him they will demand the more."

Walking around in the grace of sacraments, we relish in our grace and mercies granted from above. After our promise to live "Life to Gospel, and Gospel to Life," we stand in witness to one another, saints and angels, and Our Lord--- that, through our lives, words and actions--- we are bearing witness to the Holy Cross, or the altar of Our Lord's sacrifice. LET'S DO IT!
